Report on the audit of the financial statements

Opinion

We have audited the accompanying Financial Statements of **E to E Operations and Maintenance Private Limited** ("the Company"), which comprises the balance sheet as at March 31, 2026, and the Statement of Profit and Loss and statement of cash flows for the year then ended, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the aforesaid Financial Statements give the information required by the Companies Act, 2013 ('Act') in the manner so required and give a true and fair view in conformity with the accounting principles generally accepted in India, of the state of affairs of the Company as at March 31, 2026, its profit and cash flows for the year ended on that date.

Basis for opinion

The Company's board of directors is responsible for the preparation of the other information. The other information comprises the information included in the Board's Report including Annexures to Management Discussion and Analysis, Board's Report, Business Responsibility Report but does not include the financial statements and our auditor's report thereon.

Our opinion on the financial statements does not cover the other information and we do not express any form of assurance conclusion thereon.

In connection with our audit of the Financial Statement, our responsibility is to read the other information and, in doing so, consider whether the other information is materially inconsistent with the Financial Statement or our knowledge obtained during the course of our audit or otherwise appears to be materially misstated.

If, based on the work we have performed, we conclude that there is a material misstatement of this other information, we are required to report that fact. We have nothing to report in this regard.

This responsibility also includes maintenance of adequate accounting records in accordance with the provisions of the Act for safeguarding of the assets of the Company and for preventing and detecting frauds and other irregularities; selection and application of appropriate accounting policies; making judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; and design, implementation and maintenance of adequate internal financial controls, that were operating effectively for ensuring the accuracy and completeness of the accounting records, relevant to the preparation and presentation of the financial statement that give a true and fair view and are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the financial statements, management is responsible for assessing the Company's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless management either intends to liquidate the Company or to cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so.

The boards of directors are also responsible for overseeing the Company's financial reporting process.

We communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit and significant audit findings, including any significant deficiencies in internal control that we identify during our audit.

We also provide those charged with governance with a statement that we have complied with relevant ethical requirements regarding independence, and to communicate with them all relationships and other matters that may reasonably be thought to bear on our independence, and where applicable, related safeguards.

Notes to the Financial Statements

(All Amounts are in Rs. In Lakhs unless otherwise stated)

1. (A). Corporate information

E to E Operations and Maintenance Private Limited ('the Company') bearing Corporate Identification number (CIN)-CIN:U63031KA2009PTC049131 is a private company domiciled in India and incorporated on 12th february 2019 under the provisions of the Companies Act, 1956 . The company is engaged in the business of Operations and Maintenance of Rail related Signalling and Track and OHE systems including Metros Rails

1. (B) (a). Basis for preparation

The financial statements of the Company have been prepared in accordance with the generally accepted accounting principles in India (Indian GAAP) under the historical cost convention on the accrual basis. GAAP comprises mandatory accounting standards notified under section 133 of the Companies Act 2013, read together with rule 7 of the Companies (Accounts) Rules 2021. Accounting polocies have been consistently applied except where a newly issued accounting standard is intially adopted or a revision to an existing standard requires a change in accounting policy hitherto in use.

(b) Use of estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with Indian GAAP requires the management to make judgments, estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of revenues, expenses, assets and liabilities and the disclosure of contingent liabilities, at the end of the reporting period. Although these estimates are based on the management's best knowledge of current events and actions, uncertainty about these assumptions and estimates could result in the outcomes requiring a material adjustment to the carrying amounts of assets or liabilities in future periods.

1.(C). Summary of significant accounting policies

(i) Tangible property, plant and equipment

Property, Plant and Equipment are stated at cost, net of accumulated depreciation and accumulated impairment losses, if any. The cost comprises purchase price (including all duties and taxes, net of duty credits, if any), borrowing costs if capitalization criteria are met and directly attributable cost of bringing the asset to its working condition for the intended use. Any trade discounts and rebates are deducted in arriving at the purchase price

Subsequent expenditure related to an item of fixed asset is added to its book value only if it increases the future benefits from the existing asset beyond its previously assessed standard of performance. All other expenses on existing fixed assets, including day-to-day repair and maintenance expenditure and cost of replacing parts, are changed to the statement of profit and loss for the period during which such expenses are incurred.

Gains or losses arising from de-recognition of fixed assets are measured as the difference between the net disposal proceeds and the carrying amount of the asset and are recognized in the statement of profit and loss when the asset is derecognized.

Capital Work in Progress

Capital work-in-progress is carried at cost comprising purchase cost, directly attributable expenditure, borrowing costs, if applicable, and other incidental expenses incurred in connection with the construction/acquisition of the assets until such time the assets are ready for their intended use.

Expenses directly relating to construction/development activities are capitalised up to the date the asset is ready for its intended use.

Capital work-in-progress is transferred to the appropriate category of property, plant and equipment upon completion and when the asset is ready for its intended use.

Items of capital work-in-progress are stated in accordance with the requirements of Accounting Standard (AS) 10 – Property, Plant and Equipment and borrowing costs, wherever applicable, are accounted for in accordance with Accounting Standard (AS) 16 – Borrowing Costs

(ii) Depreciation on tangible property, plant and equipment

Depreciation is provided on the straight line method as per the useful lives of the assets as estimated by the management, which are lower or equal to the corresponding useful lives prescribed under Schedule II of the Act.

(iii) Intangible assets

Intangible assets acquired separately are measured on initial recognition at cost. Following initial recognition, intangible assets are carried at cost less accumulated amortization and accumulated impairment losses, if any.

Intangible assets are amortized on a straight-line basis over its useful life as estimated by the management. The amortization period and the amortization method are reviewed at least at each financial year end. If the expected useful life of the asset is significantly different from previous estimates, the amortization period is changed accordingly.

Gains or losses arising from derecognition of an intangible asset are measured as the difference between the net disposal proceeds and the carrying amount of the asset and are recognized in the statement of profit and loss when the asset is derecognized.

Internally generated intangible assets, excluding capitalized development costs, is reflected in the statement of profit and loss in the year in which the expenditure is incurred.

Intangible assets under development are carried at cost comprising directly attributable costs incurred in relation to development of the intangible assets. Such costs are accumulated until the assets are ready for their intended use and are not amortized until the assets are available for use. Upon completion, such assets are classified under intangible assets and amortized over their estimated useful lives in accordance with Accounting Standard (AS) 26 – Intangible Assets, Expenditure incurred during the research phase is charged to the Statement of Profit and Loss as incurred. Development expenditure is capitalized only when the recognition criteria prescribed under AS 26 are satisfied

(iv) Impairment of tangible and intangible assets

The carrying amounts of assets are reviewed at each balance sheet date if there is any indication of impairment based on internal/external factors. An impairment loss is recognized wherever the carrying amount of an asset exceeds its recoverable amount. The recoverable amount is the greater of the assets net selling price and value in use. In assessing value in use, the estimated future cash flows are discounted to their present value using a pre-tax discount rate that reflects current market assessments of the time value of money and risks specific to the asset. After impairment, depreciation is provided on the revised carrying amount of the assets over its remaining useful life.

(v) Revenue recognition

Revenue is recognized to the extent that it is probable that the economic benefits will flow to the Company and the revenue can be reliably measured.

Income from services :

Revenues from training and certification services are recognized as and when services are rendered. Revenue from maintenance contracts are recognized pro-rata over the period of the contract as and when services are rendered. The Company collects service tax on behalf of the government and, therefore, it is not an economic benefit flowing to the Company. Hence, it is excluded from revenue.

The Company recognizes unbilled revenue in respect of services rendered during the reporting period where the related services have been performed and the amount of revenue is determinable with reasonable certainty, but the related invoice has not been raised as at the reporting date due to pending client confirmation or completion of billing formalities.

Such unbilled revenue is recognized based on the terms of the underlying contractual arrangement, services performed, applicable agreed rates and other relevant supporting documentation. The subsequent receipt of client confirmation or raising of the invoice does not result in recognition of revenue again, to the extent the revenue has already been recognized in the period in which the services were rendered.

Interest :

Interest income is recognized on a time proportion basis taking into account the amount outstanding and the applicable interest rate.

Dividends:

Dividend income is recognized when the Company's right to receive dividend is established by the reporting date.

(vi) Borrowing costs

Borrowing cost includes interest, amortization of ancillary costs incurred in connection with the arrangement of borrowings.

Borrowing costs directly attributable to the acquisition, construction or production of an asset that necessarily takes a substantial period of time to get ready for its intended use or sale are capitalized as part of the cost of the respective asset. All other borrowing costs are expensed in the period they occur.

(vii) Retirement and other employee benefits

(i) Retirement benefit in the form of provident fund is a defined contribution scheme. The contributions to the provident fund are charged to the statement of profit and loss for the year when the contributions are due. The Company has no obligation, other than the contribution payable to the provident fund.

(ii) Gratuity liability under the The Code of Social Security, 2020 is a defined benefit obligation and is provided for on the basis of an actuarial valuation on projected unit credit method made at the end of each financial year.

(iii) Accumulated leave, which is expected to be utilized within the next 12 months, is treated as short-term employee benefit. The Company measures the expected cost of such absences as the additional amount that it expects to pay as a result of the unused entitlement that has accumulated at the reporting date. The Company treats accumulated leave expected to be carried forward beyond twelve months, as long-term employee benefit for measurement purposes. Such long-term compensated absences are provided for based on the actuarial valuation using the projected unit credit method at the year-end. Actuarial gains/losses are immediately taken to the statement of profit and loss and are not deferred.

The Company presents the entire leave as a current liability in the balance sheet, since it does not have an unconditional right to defer its settlement for 12 months after the reporting date.

(iv) Actuarial gains and losses are recognized in full in the period in which they occur in the statement of profit and loss and are not deferred.

(viii) Income taxes

Tax expense comprises current and deferred tax. Current income-tax is measured at the amount expected to be paid to the tax authorities in accordance with the Income-tax Act, 1961 enacted in India and tax laws prevailing in the respective tax jurisdictions where the Company operates. The tax rates and tax laws used to compute the amount are those that are enacted or substantively enacted, at the reporting date. Current income tax relating to items recognized directly in equity is recognized in equity and not in the statement of profit and loss.

Deferred income taxes reflect the impact of timing differences between taxable income and accounting income originating during the current year and reversal of timing differences for the earlier years. Deferred tax is measured using the tax rates and the tax laws enacted or substantively enacted at the reporting date. Deferred income tax relating to items recognized directly in equity is recognized in equity and not in the statement of profit and loss.

Deferred tax liabilities are recognized for all taxable timing differences. Deferred tax assets are recognized for deductible timing differences only to the extent that there is reasonable certainty that sufficient future taxable income will be available against which such deferred tax assets can be realized. In situations where the Company has unabsorbed depreciation or carry forward tax losses, all deferred tax assets are recognized only if there is virtual certainty supported by convincing evidence that they can be realized against future taxable profits.

The carrying amount of deferred tax assets are reviewed at each reporting date. The Company writes-down the carrying amount of deferred tax asset to the extent that it is no longer reasonably certain or virtually certain, as the case may be, that sufficient future taxable income will be available against which deferred tax asset can be realized. Any such write-down is reversed to the extent that it becomes reasonably certain or virtually certain, as the case may be, that sufficient future taxable income will be available.

Deferred tax assets and deferred tax liabilities are offset, if a legally enforceable right exists to set-off current tax assets against current tax liabilities and the deferred tax assets and deferred taxes relate to the same taxable entity and the same taxation authority.

(ix) Provisions

A provision is recognized when the Company has a present obligation as a result of past event, it is probable that an outflow of resources embodying economic benefits will be required to settle the obligation and a reliable estimate can be made of the amount of the obligation. Provisions are not discounted to their present value and are determined based on the best estimate required to settle the obligation at the reporting date. These estimates are reviewed at each reporting date and adjusted to reflect the current best estimates.



(x) Contingent Liability

A contingent liability is a possible obligation that arises from past events whose existence will be confirmed by the occurrence or non-occurrence of one or more uncertain future events beyond the control of the Company or a present obligation that is not recognized because it is not probable that an outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation. A contingent liability also arises in extremely rare cases where there is a liability that cannot be recognized because it cannot be measured reliably. The Company does not recognize a contingent liability but discloses its existence in the financial statements.

(xi) Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents for the purposes of cash flow statement comprise cash at bank and in hand and short-term investments with an original maturity of three months or less.

(xii) Cash Flow Statement :

Cash flows are reported using the indirect method where by profits before tax is adjusted for the effects of transactions of a non cash nature any deferrals or accruals of past or future operating cash receipts or payments and item of income or expenses associated with investing or financing cash flows. The cash flows from operating, Investing and financing activities of the company are segregated.

xiii) Income tax Disclosure

Pursuant to the introduction of Section 115BAA of the income tax Act, 1961 vide taxation laws (Amendment) ordinance, 2019 the company has an option to pay corporate Income tax at the rate of 22% plus applicable surcharge and cess (lower rate) as against the earlier rate of 25% plus applicable surcharge and cess, subject to certain conditions. Considering all the provisions under said section 115BAA of the Income tax act, 1961 the company has decided to avail the lower rate from FY 2019-20.
